The completed form MUST be returned to your advisor on Thursday, February 4. If no elective courses are selected, students will be automatically enrolled in elective courses based on availability.

All students must fill 7 periods with course selections. The requests for the required courses such as English, math, science, social studies, physical education and health will be completed for you based on course sequence. Students currently enrolled in a world language, choir, band, a CACTC program, or an advanced art program will automatically be advanced to the next sequential course. Students will have the opportunity to review these course requests with their counselor at a later date.

In addition to the core academic subjects and electives listed above, students will need to select elective courses in order to fill the schedule and meet the total credit requirement for graduation. In order to do so, it is important to review course descriptions and prerequisites for courses in the Program of Studies which can be found on our website under scheduling information (www.cpsed.net/chsw/index.htm). When making your selections, please keep in mind the courses you have already taken and your post secondary goals. Please refer to the following list to determine the number of elective credits you need to

select to complete your schedule. (Core academics = English, science, social studies, math) (**Bold text – preselected for you** (*Italic text – number of elective credits to choose*))

- **4 core academic, PE/Health only** – select 2.5 elective credits below
- **4 core academic, PE/Health, world language** – select 1.5 elective credits below
- **4 core academic, PE/Health, world language, art/music**, - select .5 elective credit below
- **4 core academic, PE/Health, CACTC program**, - select 1 elective credit below
- **4 core academic, PE/Health, CACTC program, world language** – no electives are to be selected

Make your selections by checking the box in front of the course number. If a course **requires a teacher recommendation** as stated in the Program of Studies, a teacher in that department must sign on the back of this form. Courses that require a signature have an asterisk (*) after the title. If no signature is provided, the course will not be requested for you. Please remember, these are course **requests ONLY**.

Oversubscription, undersubscription, or scheduling conflicts may necessitate course changes.

During the next two months, counselors will meet with all students to discuss elective choices, graduation requirements, and academic course requests to ensure graduation requirements will be met. **Complete schedule request lists will be sent home in April for parent review and signature. Counselors will address any parent concerns regarding the 2011 schedule after completed course requests have been sent home in April.**
